Background

Malay Muslims are a religious as well as ethnic minority in Sri Lanka. Their heritage, culture, and language are all distinct. Their customs, cultures, and languages must be preserved and passed down to future generations. The project's goal is to digitize Professor B.A. Hussainmiya's collection in order to preserve and document Malay and Yawi-related materials.

Objective

- To preserve and document the Malay and Yawi related documents by digitizing Professor B.A Hussainmiya's collection
- To draw attention to the importance of the Malay community and the Yawi language.
- To encourage the next generation and researchers to learn and explore the Malay and Yawi languages.

Activities

- Digitalization: Professor B.A. Hussainmiya's collection has 4230 pages of materials. Depending on the document type, certain documents require A4 scanning, while others require camera scanning. Noolaham Foundation Digital Preservation Officer will digitize the documents with right scanning methods.
- **Quality Check:** Quality Assurance Officer will check the quality of documents and send them for writing metadata.
- Writing Metadata: Professor B.A. Hussainmiya will be responsible for writing metadata for the documents.
- Upload documents: The documents will be upload to the Noolaham Website:

Outcomes

- This program will emphasize the cultural significance of the Malay population and the Yawi language.
- Academics and students will learn about the Malay community and Yawi Language..
- Provide free access to Malay and Yawi related documents.

Risk and Management
